Two Year Old Progress Check

Soon after your child turns 2, the key person working with your child will complete the two year old progress check for your child. A review meeting will be arranged, this will often coincide with the parent consultations where the key person will present a written summary of how your child is progressing against the 3 prime areas of learning:

- communication and language;
- physical development; and
- personal, social and emotional development.

This check will highlight areas where your child is progressing well and anywhere they might need some extra help or support – and how mums and dads and other family members or carers can work with the key person to help. You might find it useful to share the information from the check with other professionals such as health visitors (who can use it as part of the health and development review).

Summative Assessments

Observations on your child, no matter what age are made on a regular basis, these are summarized in a summative assessment under the areas of:

- communication and language;
- physical development;
- personal, social and emotional development;
- literacy;
- mathematics;
- understanding the world; and
- expressive arts and design.

The assessment will highlight the next steps for your child to progress and will make up their Learning Journey which will go with them to their infant school.
